Dear Ms. Finlayson and Ms. Jackson:

On Saturday afternoon, *MSNBC* reported that Thomas Homan, the current Border Czar to the President, received \$50,000 in cash from undercover FBI agents on September 20th of last year in exchange for future assistance in winning government contracts in a second potential Trump Administration.¹ If Mr. Homan did receive such a payment, it does not appear to have been reported on Mr. Homan's New Entrant OGE Form 278e, filed with the Department of Homeland Security on February 10, 2025.² As a result, Democracy Defenders Fund (DDF) calls on you to take the necessary actions to determine whether Mr. Homan falsified his report by failing to disclose this \$50,000 payment.

The Ethics in Government Act requires that each new public financial disclosure filer must provide a "full and complete statement" — including the "source, type, and amount" — of "income . . . from *any* source" that is received "in the year of filing and the preceding calendar year" and that is in excess of \$200.³

As a new filer, Mr. Homan was obligated to report all income he received in 2024 on his new entrant report. A review of that report identifies no payments of \$50,000.⁴ The only compensation he has reported is \$360,000 in salary from his consulting firm, Homeland Strategic Consulting, LLC, as well as \$96,469 in speakers' fees from JL Wilkinson Consulting, and a variety of honoraria for speeches given in 2023 and 2024.⁵

Knowingly and willfully failing to report any information required to be reported on a public financial disclosure report is a criminal offense.⁶ DDF therefore requests that you initiate an investigation to determine whether Mr. Homan's report is inaccurate considering these recent allegations.⁷ If you conclude that Mr. Homan has failed to report this information, DDF requests that you direct Mr. Homan to update his report and that you refer the matter to the Attorney General.
